History Behind the name Karnataka

On November 1, 1973, Vishala Mysuru Rajya was renamed as Karnataka, 17 years after the unification of states in 1956. Karnataka Rajyotsava, celebrated on November 1st each year, holds a special place in the hearts of Kannadigas. This significant day marks the formation of the State of Karnataka and the unification of Kannada-speaking regions. For the State to get its name, many activists and politicians had to fight for 17 long years before the Devaraj Urs-led government christened the state Karnataka on 1st November 1956, regions in South India where Kannada was the predominant language came together to establish the state of Karnataka.





This merger included areas from the former Madras, Bombay, and Hyderabad states. Aluru Venkata Rao, a renowned Indian historian, and writer wanted to form the state of Karnataka through the Karnataka Ekikarana movement. Kannada Rajyotsava Day is not just a festival; it carries cultural, social, and political importance. It is a day to celebrate our state's vibrant culture and heritage, and to renew our commitment to the Kannada language. Ramaiah Arts Commerce and Science college organised a grand celebration on 3rd November 2023 and Flt Lt Sunita Dixit (Retd) Principal Ramaiah Pre-university College was the guest for the event which was held with great vigour at the Abdul Kalam auditorium.
