"Nasha Mukth Abhiyan"-A Drug Awareness Program



A drug awareness seminar, "Nasha Mukth Abhiyan", was held at RCPUC on 3rd September 2024. The seminar aimed to educate students on the dangers of drug abuse and ways to prevent addiction. Dr Mallappa Adivappa Tukkanavar (MBBS), working at M S Ramaiah Medical College in the Anatomy, a noted psychiatrist and addiction specialist, was the keynote speaker. The presentation covered the types of drugs, their effects on the brain and body, and the psychological impact of addiction. He stressed the importance of prevention through education and shared information on available rehabilitation resources. An interactive session followed, where students raised concerns about peer pressure and early signs of addiction.

"Empowerment in Action: Unlocking the Skills of Self-Defence"



A self-defence seminar was held on 13th September 2024, organised by the Disaster Management Committee of RCPUC. The event aimed to equip students, especially female students, with essential self-defence skills and raise awareness about personal safety. The seminar was led by DYSP Ramesh from Tumkur and Capt Sahana Sundar of NCC, who demonstrated basic self-defence techniques such as blocking, striking, and escaping holds. She also emphasized situational awareness and the importance of staying calm during dangerous situations. Students participated in hands-on practice and engaged in an interactive session, asking questions about real-life threats and self-defence strategies.

The seminar was a success, leaving students more confident in their ability to protect themselves. It was recommended that similar sessions be held regularly for continued practice and awareness.
