## **PUC Board Examination Meeting**

The Karnataka Pre-University Certificate (PUC) examinations is conducted by the Department of Pre-University Education (PUE), Karnataka. To ensure a smooth and secure examination process, the department has established comprehensive guidelines and protocol meeting at MES Kishore Kendra. Principals meeting comprise of following points:

### **Examination Day Protocols**

- **Arrival Time:** Students are required to reach the examination hall at least 30 minutes before the scheduled start time.
- **Permitted Items:** Only essential stationery items, such as pens and rulers, are allowed. Electronic devices, including calculators and mobile phones, are strictly prohibited.
- **Reading Time:** An additional 15 minutes is provided for students to read the question paper before commencing the examination.
- **Uniform Code:** Regular students must adhere to the prescribed uniform code. Private candidates are exempt from this requirement



## Security and Surveillance

- Restricted Zones:** A 200-meter radius around examination centers is designated as a restricted area to prevent unauthorized access.
- Surveillance Measures:** CCTV cameras are installed for continuous monitoring. Police personnel and exam squads are deployed to detect and prevent malpractices
- Transport Arrangements:** The Karnataka State Road Transport Corporation (KSRTC) provides free bus services for students traveling to and from their examination centers.

## Practical Examinations

- Centre Allocation:** Starting from the 2024-25 academic year, practical examination centers are assigned randomly, similar to written exams. Students are not permitted to appear for practical exams at their own colleges. The Deputy Directors of the department (DDPUs) identify and recommend colleges that can serve as practical examination centers.
