TRAVERSING THE SCENIC PATHWAYS TOWARDS OUR DESTINATION

On the morning of March 14, 2025, at 9:00 AM, the students and faculty of Ramaiah Pre-University College embarked on an enlightening journey to the historic town of Kaiwara. The day's itinerary encompassed the tranquil **Kailasagiri Temple**, the contemplative environs of Tapovana, and the time-honoured Alamgiri Temple. The Kailasagiri temple in Karnataka has a history linked to both the epic Mahabharata and the saint Narayanappa (also known as Kaiwara Thathayya). It's believed to be the location where the Pandavas stayed during their exile, and where Bhima killed the demon Bakasura.

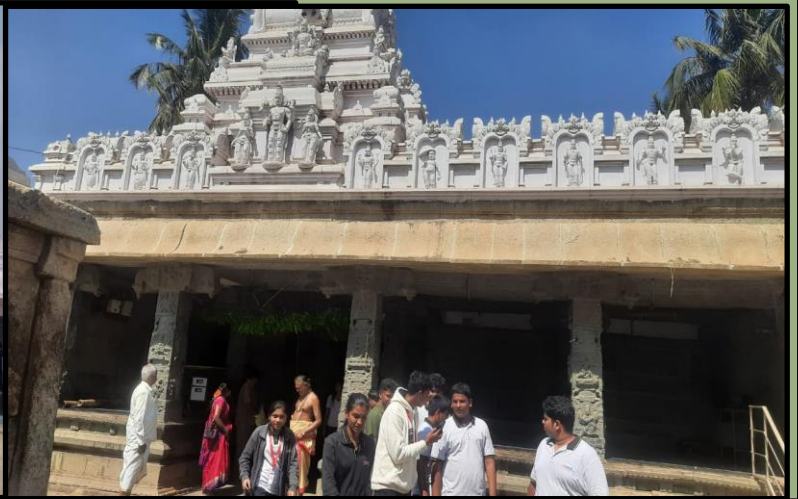


By afternoon we reached revered Kailasagiri Temple, a sanctum meticulously carved into the very core of a cavern. The ascent along its undulating terrain afforded us the privilege of offering our devotions to the supreme deity, Lord Shiva. The temple's most remarkable feature is its extraordinary four-faced idol of Shiva—a rarity, purportedly found only beyond the borders of Nepal, according to the temple's learned sage. Following our veneration of Lord Shiva, we extended our reverence to Goddess Parvati and Lord Ganesha before setting forth towards our next sacred site.



The tranquil ambience within the Kailasagiri cave enveloped us in serenity, as we engaged in meditation through the harmonious chanting of 'Om'.

Our subsequent halt was the **Kaiwara Yogi Narayana Temple** and the adjoining Kaiwara Yogi Narayana Mutt. The temple's architectural grandeur was truly awe-inspiring. A sumptuous luncheon was graciously offered to us, after which we enjoyed a brief period of rest, indulged in some leisurely shopping, and prepared ourselves for the next leg of our journey.
