Hindi Diwas, observed annually on 14 September, marks the historic adoption of Hindi in the Devanagari script as one of the official languages of India by the Constituent Assembly in 1949. Following India's independence in 1947, the need for a unifying link language led to extensive deliberations. On 14 September 1949, a consensus was reached to adopt Hindi as the official language, while English was permitted for official use for a transitional period of 15 years. The first Hindi Diwas was celebrated in 1953, and since then, the occasion has been observed across the nation to promote the richness, relevance, and unity of the Hindi language.

Ramaiah Pre-University College commemorated Hindi Diwas on 14 September 2025 under the guidance of the Hindi Lecturer Mrs. Sugina K. The celebration was conducted with great enthusiasm, cultural pride, and reverence for the language. The programme highlighted the importance of Hindi as a national language and inspired students to appreciate, preserve, and actively use Hindi in their everyday communication.

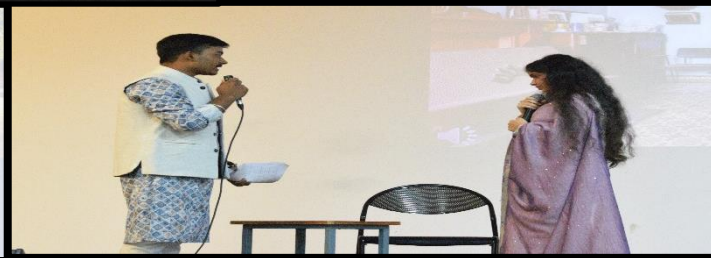
